



On August 7th over 20 members of the Gardening Club visited Mayfield Farm near Ardleigh the home and gardens of Ed and Jen Fairey. On 3rd July, Ed had visited the club to give us a talk on the National Garden Scheme (NGS) and our visit to his home and garden in August made a perfect follow up to this.



His enthusiasm and energy in turning, what for the most part, was originally a semi derelict home and garden was much in evidence. The variety of trees and plants and their placement within the garden areas showed what was possible with some careful thought and planning, although as Ed reminded us, he has had no horticultural or gardening training. Although the season for the majority of flowers that grow from bulbs had passed, the scale of Ed's planting was inspiring. Whilst we might purchase a few dozen bulbs, Ed's numbers ran into the hundreds of thousands, reason enough to possibly look forward to a further garden visit spring time next year?

After looking around the formal garden area to the front of the house we sat and enjoyed refreshments of tea/coffee

and cakes various. This was followed by a visit to the kitchen garden, the yet unfinished glass house that will house grapevines, a building that will house the pumping and filtration for a new swimming pool, the roof of which had been specifically designed for the growing sedums all of which appear to be flourishing. Finally, we walked to the paddock area, containing fruit trees and a fully equipped and very comfortable looking Shepherds Hut.

For September we enjoyed Marc McHearn's talk on re-wilding and on October 2nd, we look forward to Dr Chris Gibson's talk of Essex Wildflowers. The season will conclude with our ever popular annual quiz on November 10th.

Rangers found themselves in when 3 weeks before the season kick off the first team manager walked away. Already facing a hill climb to rebuild as no players from the 2022-23 season returned. The club faced a mountain, and an emergency meeting took place and Mark Pilgrim was appointed to the post. Mark will get 100% support the club committee and he has already worked his socks off to put a team together. The club owe him a huge debt of gratitude as the other option would have been to fold the team.

An interesting season lies ahead in what could be a very bumpy road but the spirit within the club will prevail. The early results have not been good, but this was to be expected against established teams who are expected to challenge for honours this season. The spirit has been good with also good behaviour being evident. Performance is improving and at the time of this report after 6 losses, the team won their first game of the season.

As a club we feel we offer players a good environment to play their football, but we will not pay players as is alleged to be the case elsewhere in our level of football. VILLAGE HALL NEWS

As reported in the August/September AA the hall was closed in late August to allow improvements and maintenance to be conducted. This proved to successful.

The central fan replaced with an LED light that allows improved main floor lighting if required. Taps updated in the toilets to eliminate the problem of taps being left on at the end of hire periods, this has caused in the short term increased water utility payments.

Also, to assist in the lessening of wasted water, a censor was fitted that switches off the water supply to the toilets and will reactivate (switch on) when persons enter the toilets.

All paint work inspected and "touched up" where required and the carpets were VAC'S cleaned.

The main hall floor was industrial cleaned, sealed and the lacquered and the vinvl floor area in front on the kitchen hatch was also industrial cleaned.

The annual fire inspection completed with new signage and renewed water extinguishers provided.

The sound proofing doors in The Munson Room also completed and should allow more privacy when the hall and Munson Room are hire simultaneously.

The oven has been professionally cleaned.

Trustees are now planning to replace all the door mats soon.

Thank you to Chris Sanderson, Russel and Stan, Fiona Harvey, and Russell Milburn for their time over the 4 days in improving our village hall.

Hire continues to be extremely healthy with a diversity from dog training through to a Theatre School during the summer break being very welcome. ST ANDREW'S REFLECTIONS

Over the summer, I've taken to learning Italian. I knew a little previously (mainly centred around acquiring beer/ coffee, and saying please and thank you) but our niece has been doing the Duolingo app for the past year and inspired me to have a go. So, thirty six days later, I'm committed. I have widened my repertoire considerably, although the sentences which stick in my mind ("I talk with the turtle"; "The small elephant does not eat well"; "Your monkey eats the pasta on my plate") might equip me better to be an Italian zoo keeper than prepare me to wander the artistic treasures of Florence. It would help me considerably if there was one word for "the" rather than six or more (really, how complicated does a language need to be?), but I'm getting there. The hardest thing for me are the exercises where you need to listen to a sentence in Italian, and then you write it down. Sometimes I get it straight away. Sometimes it sounds like Italian, but its meaning could be Martian; I have no idea at

Having no idea at all is quite a natural state for me. I have no idea how the metal box I am flying in to Croatia stays up. I have no idea about the size of the space which surrounds our planet. I don't understand why wars continue when so much pain is inflicted, or why people are moved to steal or inflict injury. I don't understand how a small mosquito can inflict so much discomfort.

However, my faith means that I do know that I trust in a God who understands it all, even the mosquito issue. Do you remember that ad for the AA, where the tagline was "...but I know a man who can"? What with the vastness of my lack of understanding, and the way I fumble though life, Italian or no Italian, I'm very grateful that I stand on a rock who knows it all, that I know a God who can.







Chairman's Report

October/November 2023

Cllr John Housden

This report opens on a sad note for the Council and the community as we pay tribute to serving Councillor John Housden who passed away on Sunday the 13th of August aged 83. John was the most senior Council member and had served as a Parish Councillor for fifteen years. His input into council planning and highways matters was immense and his qualifications in architecture stood him in good stead for decision making on both of these topics. He was a knowledgeable and kind man and his generosity to charitable works was outstanding. Apart from his Council and other community activities in Alresford (including his contribution to many local Christmas gatherings with his infamous homemade mulled wine) John was involved in the Masons, he assisted with marshalling the London Marathon, he was a Trustee of the Essex Retired Police Dogs Fund and he was a Freeman of the City of London. John will be greatly missed by so many. Our condolences to Helen and all the family.

Highways

Works have been authorised by the Parish Council in order to address some of the kerbstone issues in the Coppice Road area. Essex County Council has insisted that we use their contractor and so we have instructed Ringway Jacobs to commence works — initially in Coppice Road itself.

Meetings

For the first time in many years no full Alresford Parish Council meeting was held in August due mainly to holidays and staff training. Day to day work still continued of course and amongst many matters we had to deal with were planning consultations, criminal damage incidents and also a discussion with our solicitor regarding a land transfer.

Administration and Audit

A considerable amount of staff time and Councillor input is required for a Parish Council to be compliant with the law and to meet operational protocols. The last few months have been especially busy in that regard as revisions have been made to policies and to terms of reference. This work in all areas of Council business, especially finance, has paid dividends as this year's audit has resulted in no recommendations being made from the External Auditor and no matters raised for action. We aim to spend taxpayers money wisely and be accountable for our actions.

Taylor Wimpey/Staunton Gate land management

Tendring District Council has signed off the site to the north of Cockaynes Lane meaning that planning obligations have been fulfilled. The "signing off" means that the public access land can be transferred to the Parish Council for management. We have instructed our solicitor to oversee the conveyance of land to Alresford Parish Council. We hope this transfer will be straightforward as we are keen to maintain the grassland and trees for the benefit of all.

Playing Field

The hot days of early summer gave way to rain throughout July and August but the playing field was at times still exceptionally busy and the new play equipment has proved popular. The provision of a hired toilet was welcomed by parents and a permanent toilet is planned.

The tennis nets were available as usual this summer and it was good to see them used by families

however it has been noted that some cracking is occurring on one court surface due to tree roots and this will need to be addressed.

History

Alresford's history is to be highlighted on two or more information boards that will be placed at strategic points in the village. A grant from the Brightlingsea based "Community Reach" group has been obtained and the layout and wording of the information boards will be prepared by a local historian.

Planning

When undertaking any building works such as property extensions it is important that residents check whether planning permission is required. Tendring District Council are our planning authority and a call to them or a visit to many of the advisory websites will help with decision making and will provide advice on the latest regulations. There has been a change in certain aspects of planning law allowing permitted development to cover many building projects that once required full planning permission. The Parish Council is informed by Tendring District Council of all Planning Applications and can offer an objection, can support an application or can offer a neutral (no objection) comment.

And finally:

Alresford Parish Council thanks the many volunteers that do so much in our village – community spirit is thriving in Alresford!

ALRESFORD BIKERS - FUN IN THE SUN

We're out and about in full flow now, as you would expect. The mileage is piling on, and instead of road dirt and brown sludge our bikes are pretty much splattered with flies now! I say "parade" laps, because they are anything but slow. In fact, many of the rider-marshals had some difficulty keeping up with the old guys, thrashing old race bikes to the limit. During one of the parades it rained spectacularly, causing it to be instantly red-flagged, and many of the spectators were forced into a large marquee until it stopped. It really was a monsoon, but not for long. Then the riding resumed! Having marshalled at that track myself several times in the past, I know how much work it took to get the parades under way again, flooding from the lake in the middle being a bit of a problem! Anyway, it was still a very enjoyable day, and the bikes were fabulous.

Yesterday, as I write this, some of us went to Copdock Bike Show, an annual event which seems to be booming back after Covid. There were more dealerships than ever there, and many more bikes for looking at and sitting on too. It is a great event for trying out bikes if you're not sure what you want, and the dealers are all very helpful and spent all day answering questions and talking bikes with thousands of punters. The trouble is, I could have easily spent a million quid. But, with a lot of walking round displays and activities, the autojumble and traders, it was very hot, and so several pauses for tea and bacon sarnies were made. One of the spectacular parts of the Copdock show is always the bike park. Not only is it superbly well organised and managed, it is huge! See the picture, and that's not all of it - I couldn't get it all in! And Summer is not over yet! There are still months of decent weather for taking ride out, and we slip in the odd ride during the week too. There are still future events coming up, especially at this time of year, the Essex & Herts Air Ambulance Run, which will have happened before you read this, but which will no doubt be a huge success, with bikers raising tens of thousands of pounds for the charity in a single day.



So we look forward to many more good rides out, most Sundays and sometimes mid-week too, and our meetings are on the second Tuesday of every month at 8pm in the Pointer Inn, where our hosts Neil and Sam always make us very welcome. So, if you're interested in bikes or want to know more, just turn up, everyone is welcome!
