#### ST ANDREW'S REFLECTIONS

## Thoughts on Life and Faith for June 2023 - Kingship – the Call to Serve

I am writing this on the afternoon of the Coronation of King Charles and Queen Camilla and I wonder what, a month or more later sticks in your mind? Is there a word or a phrase or an image that you still remember?

I was struck at the time, and I hope it will stay with me, that virtually the first words that were said in the Coronation Service was the King - 'I come not to be served but to serve'. And this theme of service ran throughout the service! All the privileges of power, wealth, influence that come with the King's role, position and wealth are to be used to serve. Justin Welby's, in his talk said. 'We are here to crown a King, and we crown a King to serve.'

Now, who said 'I come not to be served but to serve' first'?

Jesus Christ of Nazareth! The person that Christians seek to follow.

The whole Coronation service was about following the way of Jesus! The Kings oaths and promises all linked into this. All the symbolism, the orb, the sceptre's the clothes that the king wore all pointed to the call, the obligation to serve. And Archbishop Justin reminded us that Jesus' 'throne was a Cross. His crown was made of thorns. His regalia were the wounds that pierced his body.'

And as part of the service, we were invited to affirm our allegiance to the King but also to follow in the same way of service. Again, to quote Archbishop Welby 'The King of Kings, Jesus Christ, was anointed not to be served, but to

serve. He creates the unchangeable law of good authority that with the privilege of power comes the duty to serve. '

So, I wonder what this means for us? In what ways are we called to live out a life of service to others? Even in our small ways we have some power to influence things for the good of others. Some of us have may more than others and on those there is the greater call to serve. But we all do influence and exert power over others, in our relationships and in the decisions that we make. How we shop, how we spend our time and money, how we vote – the list goes on.

So, a few weeks after the Coronation I would like to make a suggestion. Take a moment to reflect on how you are called to serve. And do something about it!

#### ANNUAL REPORT FOR AGM

As we have progressed out of the Covid period the hall has reverted to the pre-covid usage of regular hire. Also, in the latter stages of the reporting period, private hire has also shown a positive increase.

However, for the Trustees on the Management Committee this last year has been a challenge. Our long-standing Treasurer/Booking Clerk has retired from these duties due to personal reasons. On behalf of the community of the village hall we thank Pat for the 17 years of service, it is only now that it is appreciated on the fantastic work that Pat did throughout the years and undoubtedly was a major contributor to the success of the hall/pavilion in these years.

On a personal level I thank Pat for the support and friendship she has giving me as Chair, and I am incredibly pleased that she intends to stay with us as a Trustee.

The Trustee's had to react quickly to this situation and in the short-term Hayley Milburn as Booking Clerk/Invoice secretary and Cath Patel as Income/Outgoings spreadsheet co-ordinator came to the rescue. A decision to change over to internet banking and quarterly invoicing for regular hire groups was mandated. The Chair and Chris Sanderson became the authorising signatories on the bank account and to date this has been a success.

Of course, as in many areas of volunteering, candidates to fill officer duties are not plentiful and it has been difficult to find a replacement for the Treasurer post. After an appeal first to user groups and then via the Alresford Advertiser we have managed to fill the position of Treasurer. The Booking Clerk duties will remain with a non-Trustee, Hayley Milburn. The Trustees are extremely grateful to Hayley for also setting up the Hallmaster, upgrading the website and managing the newly created generic email address.

The Chair has also functioned as keyholder, and this has proved successful with new users always greeted at start of hire and checked at end of hire. This has resulted in the hall left in incredibly good condition and especially on a Saturday evening hire the hall vacated on time.

As already reported, the new internet banking site was developed, and this has enabled a now in advance refundable deposit to be requested prior to all private hire and allowed instant access to the account to confirm payment of hire fees.

Thank you also to Cath Patel for taking on the income/ outgoing spreadsheet co-ordination. Without this the Finance report would have been impossible and we would have failed in our duty as Trustees.

We also have Nicola Lockwood Pugh as secretary and Chris Sanderson to acknowledge. The secretary keeps everything on track and of course produces minutes for all.

Chris continues to fund raise, repair, and manage our utility contracts, which during this year of high energy costs has proved an invaluable service to all our users.

Another unsung hero is Jeanette Downing, a non-trustee who has helped raise over £1000 this past year in holding the Simply Singing every other Friday.

This has left the village hall funds in an extremely healthy position and has allowed us as Trustees to look forward with a degree of confidence in the future years which could present new challenges to our village hall.

Ms Elysia Thompson our cleaner has continued to maintain the hall to an extremely high standard of cleanliness in the hall at an extremely competitive cost.

#### What have the Trustees done:

- Insurance premium fixed for 3 years until 2023.
- Regular Hire Charges not increased for the 18th year in succession.
- Health and Safety handbook updated.
- All Risk Assessment and P.A.T completed.
- Regular updates provided for Alresford Advertiser.
- Village Hall website improved.
- Charity Commission report submitted.
- Hallmaster introduced as online calendar for availability.
- Gas and Fire Annual checks completed.
- Redecoration of foyer and toilets.
- Hall floor repolished.
- Introduced internet banking.
- The Munson Room now has one regular hire and has been used on more occasions for interviews/AGM'S.
- Reduced the overhanging tree. And shrub foliage on north side of hall.
- Introduced quarterly invoicing for regular hire groups.
- Introduced a booking/security deposit for all private hire.

We will continue to work in partnership with the Parish Council and St Andrews to provide facilities to our village and the surrounding areas that are relevant and at the lowest possible cost.

The Trustee's state that regard to the Charity Commission's public benefit guidance is made when exercising any powers or duties to which the guidance is relevant.

#### The Trustees will endeavour to:

- Keep hire fees at the lowest possible level.
- Provide update and news via the Alresford Advertiser.
- To administer and manage all that is required to allow the village hall to function.
- To continue to explore fund raising events such as Shop'nTreat, Film nights and Simply Singing.
- Work in partnership with the Parish Council to continue to provide excellent facilities for the communities of Alresford and the surrounding areas.
- Develop a medium to long term hall management plan part of which will be to encourage involvement from younger members of the community, who are not necessarily associated with existing hire groups, to become active in hall management and fund-raising activities.
- To replace all north side guttering.
- Explore manual timed switching for airflow units.
- Organise Defibrillator course.
- Soundproof Munson Room
- Recruit a kev holder
- Obtain a licence to enable screening of copy right films etc.

The Trustees give substantial amounts of their time to the Village Hall and their reward is seeing the continued use and enjoyment that our community gains from the Village Hall.

The Trustees will strive to listen to comments and make improvements that will serve the community, whilst maintaining all the basic requirements that need to be executed to allow the Hall to function.



### ALRESFORD PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

Every four years an election is held for members of a Parish Council to be elected to office. In most four-year cycles and in many communities the election is uncontested as the number of candidates is often either equal to or less than the requisite number. The election held this year in Alresford had twelve candidates for the eleven seats and so a contested election was held. Following the election, we now have a full compliment of eleven Parish Councillors to serve the community.

We will soon be considering a four-year plan of projects and objectives and ask that residents approach us with ideas for community improvements that fall within the powers of a Parish Council.

The last four years have been very busy for the Council and even with the two year problems of the pandemic there have been significant accomplishments. In 2019 the Parish Council played the main role in Alresford winning Essex Village of the Year followed a year later by the Council being accredited with the Foundation Award for Competency from the National Association of Local Councils. In 2022/23 we were delighted to come first in all three categories of the Essex Playing Fields Competition for Best Kept Playing Field, Best Kept Football Pitch and Best Kept Play Area – credit being given to the many volunteers who assist the community. The finalising of the Alresford Neighbourhood Plan and it's subsequent support at the village referendum was another major accomplishment, made possible by volunteer support. The Plan gives local people a real say in shaping the village for the future. Last month we oversaw the installation of new play equipment and seating for the Parish Council owned play area, the bulk of the finance for this coming from Section 106 planning gain money. The project came about from consultations and planning carried out by Councillors, work experience students and staff.

Two of the new items of play equipment

Keeping the Precept low whilst still maintaining services and progressing projects is always a challenge especially with inflation and energy costs so high but the Parish Council has done it's very best to maintain standards. Recognition and feedback from the community is always welcome and appreciation for the work of all the volunteer Councillors is so good to have. Works at St Peter's to improve the landscaping has received very favourable responses as have other public realm improvements. A key feature of





forthcoming projects will be public area improvements in-line with suggestions gleaned from the Neighbourhood Plan surveys.

Issues that crop up from residents are often highways related – such as damaged kerbstones and pavements, potholes in the road and the amount of Heavy Goods Vehicles travelling through the village. Whilst none of these are the responsibility of a Parish Council we always follow-up to the appropriate body when these matters are raised. We also become directly involved where we have powers to act – albeit within the statutory limitations to our powers. The issue over the appalling loose and missing kerbstones on a number of roads is one the Council tirelessly tries to address. The kerbstone responsibility rests entirely with Essex County Council Highways but as they do not deem it a priority little happens. The Parish Council voted to carry out works itself and has done this under the Highways Devolution scheme, the scheme has unfortunately been withdrawn by Essex Highways but we are determined to continue fixing kerbs for the benefit of the community and although now being forced to use ECC Highways contractors we intend to do our best to address some of the worst areas for loose kerbstones ,subject to acceptable quotations for the works and our budget!

A major disappointment to the Council has been the very protracted exercise of the handing over of the Taylor Wimpey Developments open spaces to Alresford Parish Council. It really is hoped that both sites North and South of Cockaynes can very soon be properly administered by us as regards public open space maintenance including the play area and the allotment plots.

The Parish Council erected flags and bunting around the village in the run up to the Coronation of King Charles III and although appropriate sites were limited the celebration bunting was well received. Benches in the play area have plaques as memorials to our late Queen Elizabeth.

Councillors wish to express grateful thanks to the staff (all part-time) of our Council who work so hard for the community. We also acknowledge the tremendous volunteering spirit that keeps the village at it's very best.

#### **DIRTY/UNREADABLE CAR REGISTRATION PLATES**

Car registration plates must be visible at all times.

It is an offence not to display one. This also includes **dirty plates** that cannot be seen.

If you are pulled over by an officer for displaying dirty unreadable plates, you could find yourself receiving a hefty fine.

If you see anything that does not look right, report it. Try and get as much information as you can, including registration numbers, which are key to a lot of activity. The more you have, the more chance we have of a positive investigation with results.





#### Our pool pre-Covid

#### Our pool now

Did you know that Alresford Primary School has a fully functioning, heated, covered swimming pool on its grounds? The roof slides partially open, which is a lovely feature in warmer weather and is 12m by 7m in size, and 1m deep. The pool is heated to a very appealing 31 to 32 degrees Celsius, when in use.

In the past, the pool has been a valuable resource for local schools and the community alike, providing in school swimming lessons for all seven, year groups at Alresford Primary School and neighbouring schools have used it to teach their pupils as well. This has saved parents, carers, and participating schools a fortune in swimming lesson costs and transport to them. There has been toddler and older adult swimming outside of school hours and local swim schools have used it to hold their lessons. It has even been hired out privately to groups for family swims and birthday parties.

Currently, the pool is structurally in very good condition, bar a deep clean and some superficial maintenance/painting. However, as the pool has not been operational since pre-Covid, the plumbing and mechanics of the filtration system need to be updated to meet current regulations before we can open it to both school users and the community again.

A group of interested parents and members of the public are invested in raising funds for the work that needs to be done and would like to appeal to everybody to get involved in our efforts to bring the pool back into use. The alternative of doing nothing and watching such a promising resource fall into disrepair would be wasteful and ultimately costly for both the school and our community.

Sadly, over recent years there have been several deaths at our local beaches, these are predominantly children, clearly demonstrating the real need for communities to have access to swimming lessons and for all children to have the opportunity to learn this valuable life skill.

Alongside the Tendring Levelling up project we want to become an inclusive provision for everybody in our extended community. As there has been a significant rise in the number of disadvantaged children living in the area, a community pool would provide affordable, accessible swimming facilities with the aim of providing subsidised swimming lessons eventually. Those that don't drive can use public transport to access the pool as we are a very short walk from the local train station and nearest bus stop. Sessions for older adults will improve access to resources that support their mobility, well-being, and mental health. Sessions for babies and pre-school children will enable parents to have affordable access to groups improving their support networks and giving young children further opportunities to interact with other young children.

Local swimming provision is inadequate and declining post Covid as more pools are closing, so in addition to the works mentioned above, our aim is to raise enough money to install heaters for the air around the pool so that it may be used all year round.
